Perth is a beautiful city right in the heart of Scotland. It is the gateway to the highlands and the perfect place to start a longer holiday in Scotland.

by car Perth is easy to get to. Head north up the M6/M74/M80, 140 miles past Carlisle and you can't miss it.

by train There are frequent trains from Edinburgh and Glasgow (Queen Street) and direct GNER trains from London King's Cross.

by air Fly to Edinburgh from Belfast, Cardiff or 14 airports around England, then get the train.
