

The Competition

The competition is held in conjunction with the United Kingdom One-act Plays Festivals. The Geoffrey Whitworth Trophy is awarded annually to an original play, debuting in the UK One-act Plays Festivals organized by the:

- All England Theatre Festival
- Association of Ulster Drama Festivals
- Drama Association of Wales
- Scottish Community Drama Association

The competition is administered by the SCDA, on behalf of AETF, AUDF, and DAW.

Geoffrey Whitworth founded the British Drama League in 1919. He was heavily involved in drama for many years and encouraged original work. His philosophy was to ensure that writers would benefit from seeing their plays performed and adjudicated.

The winning play may have a rehearsed reading at the British Final Festival.

The Geoffrey Whitworth Trophy will be presented to the winning writer at the British Final Festival.

Rules

1. Plays shall conform to each festival's rules, and must be performed in Stage 1 of the current festival season.
2. Plays **must not** have been publicly performed or published prior to the date of their performance in Stage 1 of the festival.
3. Entries must include the author's written permission to enter the play into the competition
4. The plays must be typed on A4 paper, size 12 font; have each page numbered; be printed single-sided; be in good condition; have **all references, which may identify the author, removed.**
5. The play must contain a brief synopsis; and a cast list. Both must be contained in one document with the script.
6. Email a PDF document of your play; and the entry form to headquarters@scda.org.uk to arrive by 30th April 2017; OR post **TWO** legible copies of your play, with an entry form, to SCDA HQ, again to arrive by 30th April 2017.
7. Plays are judged on reading and not on performance. A judge appointed by the SCDA, will independently assess the plays. The judge's decision is final.
8. Copyright of all plays entered will remain with the author. Winning plays which are subsequently published must acknowledge the competition.
